Ice Scheduler's Report – John:

- Season Ice Contract is confirmed

Registrar's Report – Mike:

- LL rosters are being submitted along with travel permits
- There are still kids signing up and we haven't turned anyone away yet
- Convenors must tell the Registrar when they are full or else he will continue to take in players,
 Michael will continue to ask if the levels are full or not.

VP of Rep/AE Report – Kevin:

- Schedule is up; most teams are not playing until tomorrow as it was late. All AE groups are full.
- LL and AE had one transfer.
- There are try out jerseys for all Rep/AE teams, will the board approve 5 more different colour jerseys for each age group which then the jerseys can be used for practice jerseys? Is that the best option? Teams will buy their own practice jerseys.

VP of Local League Report – Jason:

- Attended Haldimand LL meeting which was held here in Caledonia; Stoney Creek is applying to go to the Alliance and may come back to our centre although we have scheduled our games for this season, if they do not get into Alliance, we would have to accept them back – this is an OMHA decision:
- Jason needs all the trophies back they are in the hockey office.
- Complaint by OMHA is that we had a lot of incorrect game sheets last year and they suggested that we have an example posted in the hockey office, Shawn Swayze will take care of this.
- 7 year olds can be moved up to Novice (see memo below)
- Some of the Novice teams are short players and they questioned if they can AP players from Tyke – yes as long as they are 7 years old;

- Motion to accept Erin Noble as the Novice Non-voting convenor and Ian Garson as the Midget non-voting convenor – seconded by Michael Kichinko and motion passed.
- Would the board consider screening tournaments that teams go into as there was an instance where the coach played in a tournament where the teams got beat badly? The board says, the coaches should ask the VP of Rep/AE if they have any questions and Coaches should look at the tournaments and not play higher caliber teams thinking this will improve their players.

Tyke Convenor/Coordinator Report – Leanne/Brent:

- Leanne went to a meeting in Delhi on Sunday which was never advertised and only knew about the meeting when she heard someone else talking about it, she is now part of the committee and they meet a few times a year. It's important for everyone to be on the same page because of the changes. They discussed the half ice games and wanted to make sure there was consistency in the half ice games at each centre. There will be no refs, no time keeper, no score, one coach on the ice with either 5 on 5 or 4 on 4.
- Everyone from Southern Counties was there but Leanne wants to know how far we will send our young players? Leanne booked the older players but not the 5 year old players at this time. Rockton and Cayuga do not have Tyke teams. Port Dover, Simcoe, Dunnville and Hagersville, Paris currently have teams.
- When we divided our teams IP2 and IP3 have 4 teams each, the other centres have two teams of 16 players so the decision was that if they went out to play other centres they would wear pinnies and share players;
- Coaching qualifications for this level is Coach 1 and they need to have a trainer (trainers can be shared by the teams);
- They wanted to confirm that goalies get the \$300 allotment every year; this was confirmed noting that the reimbursement can be requested from Sep – Mar of the hockey season.

Development Convenor Report – Heather:

- All sessions are full, there are a few people on the waiting list and there were IP parents that requested to have their children participate who are 6 year olds.
- If spaces become available because of ill children, is it agreeable that we open it up to players outside the organization such as the River Cats? There is no waiting list for our LL session at this time, we would charge those outside the organization more money and they must be registered with an organization.
- Is there a policy on phones or media in the dressing room? This would be a county policy and there are rules posted in the dressing room.

Equipment Manager's Report – Jeremy:

- Everything handed out, there were some issues with some of them and we had to order one jersey
- We are out of first aid kits, do we have a supplier for this? There are places that sell them and if we need to purchase? We will also need to restock. Jeremy will look into this.
- Midget LL needed extra nets and we were under the impression that the County had extra nets but we couldn't find them – Jeremy will inquire.
- Would minor hockey consider purchasing nets? We will need to look first to see what the County has.
- The small nets are for use with the Tyke teams only and should not be used by any of the other levels in hockey. Jamie will also e-mail the County to remind them that they shouldn't be used by any other levels or organizations.

Appendix B Coach Liaison

Coach Liaison

To better the recruitment, training and retention of all levels of CDMHA coaches; to further the goals of the CDMHA Board with regard to coaching; and to assist with the on-ice skill training of CDMHA players; it is recommended that the position of CDMHA Coach Liaison be created.

It is intended the Coach Liaison be a non-executive, unpaid position. However, the duties and title of this position can be assigned to a CDMHA Board Member, provided the Board Member is not currently: President; VP Rep/AE; VP LL; or Development Convenor.

The Coach Liaison will report to the VP's of Rep/AE and VP Local League. The term of the position is for two years. Elected by majority vote of Board.

The duties of the Coach Liaison will be

- To liaise with VP Rep/AE and VP LL and present coach issues and/or concerns.
- To make regular reports to the CDMHA Board
- Be a member of the Coach Selection Committee
- To construct Coach evaluation forms
- To help recruit, train and keep coaches
- To assist first time head-coaches
- To ensure that team officials have minimum required qualifications and certifications.
- To organize and help book and arrange courses for team officials requiring certification (i.e. training, coaching, certification, prevention courses etc.)
- To assist Player Development co-ordinator on training clinics for players
- To assist Player Development co-ordinator develop an age-appropriate book of drills
- To assist coaches implement the Drill Book.
- Keep team officials informed and updated on all relevant Executive decisions.
- Keep team officials informed and updated on new or pertinent OMHA and/or Southern Counties decisions or rules.

Qualifications

All applicants must ...

- Possess the qualifications needed to coach any team for the Association and have a minimum of three years of minor hockey head-coach experience
- be able to offer any assistance or direction to resources, tournament sites, books, videos, web sites or other knowledgeable people.
- Be available to assist with any team that may require assistance on the bench during a game or for a practice due to suspensions, work, illness, etc.
- Be a reputable member of the community and in good standing with CDMHA.

SUBJECT: Initiation Program Implementation and Sanctions

Attached please find a Memo as issued through the OHF with respect to Initiation Program Implementation and Sanctions. This was addressed by the OMHA Board at its meetings of September 16-17, 2017.

The Board has directed that the OMHA will follow the OHF memo "Clarification Initiation Program Implementation" dated September 13, 2017 when approving Tyke rosters.

If players five-and-six-years-old are registered to play in programming designed for seven-year-olds, it must also be cross-ice/half-ice hockey. The only exception, is if the seven year-old programming with players six-years-old and under has been approved by the Member (in this case the OMHA).

The Member approval set out above is based on instances where players six-and-under are required to form a Team predominantly made up of seven-year-old players. The only scenario in which this will be permitted are cases where the number of six year olds being added will meet the minimum roster requirement of eleven players. The key criteria being that without the six-year-old players, those seven-year-old players would have no opportunity to play the game of hockey in their community.

Re: CLARIFICATION Initiation Program Implementation

Below is the requested clarification to the OHF Memo "Initiation Program Implementation" dated July

13, 2017.

To be clear **all** programming, regardless of skill, for players aged five-years-old and six-years-old must be provided in cross-ice/half-ice format. This includes practices and games. If a Minor Hockey Association fails to provide cross-ice/half-ice programming, it will not be provided sanctioning to attend or host tournaments for **all** age groups in the MHA.

Secondly, if players five-and-six-years-old are registered to play in programming designed for seven-year-olds, it must also be cross-ice/half-ice hockey. The only exception, is if the seven-year-old programming with players six-years-old and under, has been approved by the Member. This is to avoid MHA's from circumventing the implementation of cross-ice/half-ice hockey for players five-and-six-years-old.

If an MHA allows players six-and-under to participate in programming for seven-year-old players **without the approval of their Member**, that MHA will not be provided sanctioning to attend or host tournaments for all age groups in the MHA.

The Member approval set out above is based on the following scenario: OHF Members have the ability, upon request, to provide written approval from the Member to that Team to participate for this season only as a seven-year-old program, in those instances where players six-and-under are required to form a Team predominantly made up of seven-year-old players. The key criteria being that without the six-year-old players, those seven-year-old players would have no opportunity to play the game of hockey in their community.
