Ice Scheduler's Report – John:

- Ice request for 2020/21 season & special events (Challenge Cup) has been submitted to the County. Expectation is the ice allocation process will begin in mid August
- County is looking to change the Facility Booking & Ice Allocation Policy delayed due to COVID-19
- Impacts of proposed changes to Policy for CDMHA:

-Number of hours allocated per week is 58 versus 58.75 allocated in 2019/20 - Number of non prime hours required would increase by 3 hours per week - this might mean that there could be earlier practices on weekends @ 6am or 6:30am or practices on weekdays before school in order for CDMHA to be allocated 58 hours. This will not be finalized until ice allocation is completed with all user groups

- Ice & Remax Room cancelled for the coaching clinic that was planned for August 29. Need to know asap if it will be scheduled for an alternate date to book ice & Remax Room
- With the uncertainty of the upcoming season any changes to ice allocation requirements need to be received asap in order to communicate with the County
- The County will only have one rink open (Almas) until October Brent spoke with the County today to confirm details (see Annex C) – as this will be the only rink through

Hagersville, Cayuga, Dunnville and Caledonia – they will stay with this until at least September and then they will re-evaluate; we did not get clarification on how they will be divvying up the ice – we think that those other centres will be coming to Caledonia to use the ice, plus girls hockey, Ringette, Figure Skating etc. There will be a lot of user groups requesting the ice.

• The certificate of insurance has been requested at this time and will be forwarded once it is received.

Registrar's Report – Mike:

 CDMHA has not opened registration as we cannot take payment at this time; we are considering opening registration without being able to take money to attempt to confirm numbers (although anyone can still back out at anytime).

 We are still waiting for the OMHA to give us the final – but it looks like at least November before we can travel outside of our own catchment and therefore, the Challenge Cup will most likely not be happening;

VP of Business Report – Lisa:

- Motion made my Lisa Turner to make the Flip Give App available for minor hockey participants to utilize while they are doing their online shopping. Each retailer uses a different type of promo weekly/monthly and the percentage goes back to the Association. Lisa will provide some information that can be reviewed by the Board and we can table this motion moving forward; See Annex C; Seconded by Mark Annett - Motion Passed

Secretary Report – Traciann:

I received an email from Mike at Off the Bench with some fundraising opportunities through a partnership with them. See Annex D. – Discussion – some felt that it sounded as if he was asking for exclusivity and it makes it difficult to control and becomes complicated – can it potentially cause a problem if we move forward with the jersey tender for next year; there are rumors out there that others are going to other vendors and getting a kickback directly to them and it seems like it would be better for the Association to receive some assistance from these sales; we cannot offer exclusivity but we can endorse to our membership to use this program; just another avenue to assist with fundraising

President Report – Brent:

- Return to Hockey Framework Stage 3 See Annex B it doesn't look like the Challenge Cup will be running this year as it falls in the 3E opening timeframe;
 - the OMHA is being very cautious regarding opening at this time

- Brent will be reaching out to the OMHA this week to get some clarification on registration and other matters within the Stage 3 framework – it looks like we will be getting on the ice in September to be able to practice and then moving toward regular hockey for December. 3A runs until Sept 1 and then should move to 3B.

- we will run only groups in September – we cannot evaluate or tryout so we have to assess based on last year – there will be no formation of teams at this time just groups

- we will wait on Registration at this time and wait for the OMHA to let us know when we can start collecting money; it shouldn't take long once the registration is open

- currently since there are no coaching clinics running, the association will need to use previous coaches/volunteers to run the development sessions at this time – no decision has been made at this time regarding groups and who will practice with who

- we may have to cut down the Discovery to half hour segments to fit all parents and skaters on the ice – to be discussed

- as an Association we will need to determine the cost based on ice time and other items
- Poll Returns on Rep/AE Amalgamation 89 votes 84% said yes and 15% said no (on website); on Facebook 115 votes – 74% said yes, 27% said no - this is for investigating this and not making any major decisions at this time;

Open Business:

- **Discussion**: Would it help to remove the late fee for those who may be waiting to see what the season looks like?? But, the Association needs to be able to plan to see numbers for programming; the association can change the late fee to later in the year. We can take a look at this at the next meeting.
- We are currently not taking registration and therefore, we can take a look at this moving forward to determine if this is even something we need to worry about;
- If there is a second wave of COVID and we are shut down, then the OMHA/OHF would most likely dictate what that looks like and if there would be a reimbursement, we would need to know if we had fees that would still need to be paid out – we could not determine a refund policy until we know where we are and what we could be obligated to still pay out;
- Action: Cost Saving Measures:
- Discussion: Minor hockey has booked about 5 hours of extra ice/week to support programming (this varies according to what the teams would need i.e. more than one practice per week, LL teams getting full ice practices a few times a year) we could take a look cutting this back or eliminating this to save some money moving forward; there is a concern about cutting ice if we need to move to smaller groups on the ice, we may need this ice but it is an option to look at; there has been a lot of discussion surrounding Midget practice time i.e. maybe not schedule a full ice practice for them or are there other options for this age group; there was discussion with Haldimand LL on cutting Midget LL practices but it didn't go anywhere for CDMHA there was approx.. 2 hours of ice per week assigned to LL Midget practices (if we move these to games, there could potentially be a cost for this for referee's and time keepers); the ice scheduler will reach out when the ice time needs to be firmed up (table this for upcoming meetings);

Annex B Return to Hockey

Stage 3 - Modified Programming

The Ontario Hockey Federation's (OHF's) Return to Hockey Framework is an incremental approach that will ensure the OHF opens in a safe way. As the OHF progresses to Stage 3 Modified Programming for the foreseeable future, OHF Members and Minor Hockey Associations (MHA's) will have different levels of preparedness and readiness which means the pace at which they move through the OHF Return to Hockey Framework will vary. It is acceptable for Associations to move through the OHF Return to Hockey Framework based on the capacity they can manage.

Stage 3 provides for additional hockey opportunities beyond the individual and group training approved in Stage 1 and 2 of the OHF Return to Hockey. It provides participants the opportunity to register in Hockey Canada programming that will include game play with rules that remove or avoid physical contact.

Definitions

No Physical Contact – means the application of the Ontario Government Emergency order in that practice and play cannot allow for physical contact between players or that play is operating under the modified rules in Appendix D to avoid physical contact between the players.

Stage 3 Modified Programming – Member Sanctioned hockey programs in compliance with the requirements of each Stage 3a, b, c, d, e operated within the Minor Hockey Associations or the Member including game play, scrimmage in practice and team practice drills.

Public Health Unit (PHU) – is an official health agency established by a group of urban and rural municipalities to provide a more efficient community health program, carried out by full-time, specially qualified staff.

Member – as defined in Article 4.1. ALLIANCE, GTHL, NOHA, OHA, OHL, OMHA, OWHA

Clarifications

Any clarifications relating to the contents of the OHF Return to Hockey Framework should be submitted to your Member and they will forward to the OHF.

Any clarifications of the operations of hockey outside of your programming or facility operation should be directed to Will Metske, OHF Director of Operations, at wmetske@ohf.on.ca.

Stage 3 will be based on the following philosophies:

• Flexibility on registering players for the participation in the 2020-2021 season and the cooperation between Associations and Members.

- Processes put in place for new participants to register as:
- Participants and families become open to registering for hockey programming, and
- More arenas become available for use.
- The opportunity for adjusted program offerings on a four-week cycle as the Government updates numbers for gathering and group participation.
- To allow for staggered opening or closure of programming based on Ontario's regional approach to reopening with minimal disruption to programs operating.

 Individual and Group Training remains a focus in August and September with addition of participants.

 No tryouts for the formation of Teams. Members to determine approach for tiered structure based on category of participation last year.

No affiliation or integration allowed between leagues.

May only participate in one league/team within the OHF.

• The boundaries of the PHU will be a guideline for competition between teams. The OHF has developed multiple levels within Stage 3 as the Ontario Government Stage 3 will continue to modify over time.

IN ALL INSTANCES THE OHF DIRECTORS WILL MAKE THE FINAL DETERMINATION AS TO THE ACTIVE LEVEL WITHIN STAGE 3 OF THE OHF RETURN TO HOCKEY FRAMEWORK THAT A MEMBER IS ELIGIBLE TO PROGRESS TO. THIS DETERMINATION WILL BE COMMUNICATED BY WAY OF MEMO FROM THE OHF TO THE MEMBERS AND POSTED ON THE OHF WEBSITE.

Stage 3a - Return to Ice Continued July 28 to August 31

Member Approved Programming in Geographic Area that is in Ontario Government Stage 3

Programming is based on Stage 1 and 2 requirements. Association programming is for participants registered with the Association for 2019-2020.

Individual and Group Training

• Maximum of 25 participants on the ice, including instructors, or a lower number if determined by Ontario Government, local PHU, the facility or Member.

• Physical distancing is required for the purpose of individual and group training and if a facility has further restrictions all programming must comply.

• Hockey Canada RTH Alternate Skills Instruction outlines skill progression programs with physical distancing as a template for programming.

From the County:

We are planning on reopening the Almas pad at the Haldimand County Caledonia Centre (HCCC) as of August 17.

Protocol Highlights include:

• The number of participants on the ice will be limited to 10 skaters and 2 coaches;

• Dressing rooms will not be available for use, so participants will need to wear their equipment to the rink;

· Chairs will be set up outside of the ice pad for putting on skates; and,

• A roster will need to be submitted a minimum of three business days prior to each ice booking. This roster will be used by Facilities Staff when participants check in at the Covid Screening table prior to entering the facility. The rosters will be used for contact tracing if needed. All rosters will be handled in a confidential manner and will be destroyed after 30 days. A full outline of the protocols will be shared with you by the middle of next week. Protocols will be reviewed and revised on an ongoing basis.

Ice allocation for September ice and Fall & Winter ice (October – March): Currently, the County is planning to operate the Almas Pad at the HCCC in September and to open all the other ice pads in October.


