## Reports:

#### Ice Scheduler's Report – John:

- Ice request for 2020/21 season for September, Challenge Cup & Coaching clinic have been cancelled
- Updated Ice request for 2020/21 needs to be submitted by September 11 need to determine ice requirements for season asap to allow time to submit
- County is looking to change the Facility Booking & Ice Allocation Policy delayed due to COVID-19
- Arena Covid-19 protocols received & forwarded to Brent & Traicann further updates to this will be coming shortly – see Annex D

## Registrar's Report – Mike:

- We currently have 263 registered for hockey in U9 U18;
- 11 registered for Discovery
- 21 registered for IP1 and 19 for IP2
- Has refunded all the Rep/AE fees except for 2 which need a cheque refund
- The numbers are coming in pretty steady since 1 Sep when we opened the Registration

## VP of Local League Report – Erin:

- Will Minor Novice fall under IP like it did last year or will it go under with Novice and then I will be responsible for it with looking for coaches and stuff for it? We are currently reviewing this with the other centres. It has been proposed we run both major and minor together.
- If the above are separate Michael are you able to split up the age column on the Registration to show the separation of the two divisions.
- What will the plan be if say we have three teams in one age group with then three extra kids what happens to those three kids while we wait for more people to sign up late? If we have more than enough players for 3 teams we will have to create 4 teams with lower numbers on each team.
- Michael When they are registering does it ask if they are wanting to Play Rep /AE or LL I cannot
  remember from signing up my own kid. If there is can a column be add to the registration saying
  if they are rep/Select or LL? If not, that is fine just trying to figure out how many coaches will be
  needed for LL. Players will be placed in the division based on last years rosters and evaluations.
  We will need to cross reference from last years rosters.
- For families that have multiple children, can a second/third sibling come into the arena while one of the siblings is playing? We will reach out to the County for this answer.
- We still need coaches for U18, U13 and U9 and a convenor for U9 and U15.
- Would we consider doing something different for convenors this year considering the tiers/bubbles but we will address this moving forward.

#### Minor Novice/IP Convenor/Coordinator Report – Candace/Paul:

- The numbers are pretty much where they expected them to be. They have capped the Discovery at 20 at this time. This may be too much considering the amount of people we are allowed on the ice. We will cap this at 18 this year.
- Waiting to hear about the minor Novice Brent will have an update later this week once we
  meet with the other centres. We may combine minor and major novice due to the no travel. The
  county has said we cannot use the dividers so we will need to just use half of the ice surface
  and not use the dividers for practice.
- If we combine minor and major novice the recommendation is for this level to play half ice all year (OMHA).
- Will order jerseys once numbers are a little more firm

#### **Development Convenor Report – Mark:**

Option 1: We can cancel development as Brent had mentioned earlier this summer. Maybe tell teams to figure out for themselves! Hopefully that is not an option because so many of the kids depend on the power skating especially in the younger ages. My rational being all coaches are not equal and especially in LL not all coaches are able to teach the techniques Or break down a drill for a kid to understand. Yes in the past we could use volunteers from older players/goalies but with all the bubble rules we can't mix groups. Unfortunately we cannot implement our development program like we have in years past due to Covid-19.

**Option 2:** We provide 2 development skates per month to each team during a scheduled team practice. These practice times could be run on the same Monday /Wednesday time

 slots we have used for development in past years. The benefit to this is the cost of ice for the 3 hrs for development is eliminated Approx \$5,999.70 in extra ice cost 19/20 season for development. If you use the latest registration number 263 so basically 26 teams from U7-U18.

- So 26 teams, 2 teams per session=13 x 10 sessions =130 hrs x \$175 = \$22750 Divide that by 263= \$86.50per player for ten sessions over the course of the season. Now these numbers are rough as I may be able to get better pricing for the amount of development needed to meet this requirements. And I know it doesn't include Goalies. But this model could be scaled up or down as the registration numbers fluctuate.
- Here are the numbers to exclude Midgets -34 kids 229 Kids = 23 teams 2 per session=12 12 x 10 sessions =120 hrs 120 x \$175 = \$ 21000 2100/229= \$91.70 per player
- Exclude Bantam -34 kids
   195 kids = 19.5 teams 2 per session= 10
   10 x 10 sessions= 100 hrs
   100 x \$175= \$17500
   \$17500/195 =\$ 89.74
- Or full registration based on 500 registrations
- 50 teams 2 per development session= 25
- 25 x 10 sessions =250 hrs
- 250 x \$175= \$43750
- \$43750/ 500 = \$87.50 per player
- If we use team scheduled practices to provide development sessions we eliminate nearly \$6000 in additional ice costs. If you take that \$6000 off the full registration number at 500 kids drops the price to \$75.5 per kid for 10 sessions for the entire season.
- If you remove the top tier teams and only provide development to Local league kids, Tier 1 teams will probably want to control their own development.
- Option 3:
- We provide several development options or plans to our membership. All teams wanting development would be responsible for collecting money and paying Association By a specified date and would be able to pick from a list of approved development providers to schedule development during a scheduled practice.
- Option 1: your team does not require development
- Option 2: powerskating 10,12,14 session programs
- Option 3: powerskating/ skills 10,12,14 session programs
- Option 4: powerskating/shooting 10, 12, 14
- session programs
- Option 5: Defensive skating/ shooting/ passing 10, 12, 14 session programs
- Option 6: Goalie development 10, 12, 14 session program
- All of these development session would be scheduled during team practices as well and prices would be negotiated with approved development providers by CDMHA prior to teams picking options. We are a stronger buyer as a group than we are apart and can provide a better development program for our dollar. I believe that more people would be interested in development if we were able to provide it during their scheduled practices so that they don't

have to come to the arena 2 or more times a week. I believe it will alleviate some pressure from coaches by planning less practices as well as provide a learning experience by watching their team do the development.

- In regards to Goalie development, at this time we cannot do group training at HCCC because all the goalies will be from different bubbles. Therefore, I recommend goalies going back to training out in the community. We may need to look at our policy at this time regarding what we would cover for goalie development.
- Mark can make a list of options that can be used for development if the teams do ask.
- I would like to put a motion on the floor to eliminate or renegotiate the cost of our scheduling and registration fees paid to John and Mike. Even if it's just for this season. Like everyone keeps saying this is unprecedented times and we need to look for ways to save money. Personally I don't think anyone should be getting paid if we are a true non profit organization and are only looking at the kids best interests. \$12000 puts a big dent in our costs that could be used to cover other costs, like more jerseys if needed or cut cost of development. Seconded – Nicole Sansom
- Discussion Not feel that this is the right time due to what they have already done; could we look at renegotiating?
- We have tried to find people for these positions in the past and there has never been anyone to
  do this position without it being a big mess you need knowledgeable people doing the
  scheduling and the registration the paperwork has to be done and done correctly if we break
  this down to the number of hours and what we pay it is fairly minimal in reality we cannot put a
  price on this; Besides their position, they bring a lot more to CDMHA then just the Registrar and
  Ice Scheduler position feel that they go above and beyond.

- <u>Action</u>: Cost Saving Measures:
- Discussion: Minor hockey has booked about 5 hours of extra ice/week to support programming (this varies according to what the teams would need i.e. more than one practice per week, LL teams getting full ice practices a few times a year) we could take a look cutting this back or eliminating this to save some money moving forward; there is a concern about cutting ice if we need to move to smaller groups on the ice, we may need this ice but it is an option to look at; there has been a lot of discussion surrounding Midget practice time i.e. maybe not

schedule a full ice practice for them or are there other options for this age group; there was discussion with Haldimand LL on cutting Midget LL practices but it didn't go anywhere – for CDMHA there was approx.. 2 hours of ice per week assigned to LL Midget practices (if we move these to games, there could potentially be a cost for this for referee's and time keepers); the ice scheduler will reach out when the ice time needs to be firmed up (table this for upcoming meetings);

- Could we move to one timekeeper for some of those games as well as potentially 1 gate keeper?

#### STAGE 3B - ARENA OPENING GUIDELINES

As of Tuesday, September 8 Haldimand County will expand its reopening protocols for the Haldimand County Caledonia Centre (HCCC) Arena Almas Ice Pad. It is currently anticipated that the County's other four ice pads (HCCC Clark, Cayuga, Dunnville and Hagersville) will open as of October 1, 2020.

These protocols include updated information related to <u>Rental Guidelines</u> and <u>Public Access</u> to the following: Common Areas (including front lobby, concessions and vending machines), Ice, Change Rooms, Spectator Seating and Walking Track.

In order to maximize safety for all:

- Anyone accessing the Arena must enter through the front doors and be screened;
- Masks must be worn in all common areas (front entrance, lobbies, hallways, change rooms) and are
  encouraged to be worn in the stands and while using the walking track;
- · Visitors/participants are asked to keep valuables at home or secured elsewhere (e.g. vehicles).

#### Ice Rental Guidelines:

- A maximum of forty (40) participants (including skaters, coaches/trainers and referees) will be allowed on the ice at one time;
- Screening will take place upon entering the Arena. Participants will be able to enter no more than 15 minutes
  prior to their scheduled rental time and must leave within 15 minutes after the rental;
- · Anyone entering the Arena and moving throughout the facility must wear a mask;
- Directional floor stickers and signage will be posted throughout the facility;
- Participants must arrive at the Arena wearing their equipment (with the exception of skates and—in the case of goalies—pads);
- Chairs will be set up outside of the ice pad for putting on skates, and participants must use the same chair for the duration of the rental;
- Change rooms will not be available for use unless they are required to accommodate overflow of participants (e.g. if not enough chairs can be made available, as noted above);
- Limited washroom facilities will be available for use;
- One (1) parent/guardian per skater will be allowed in the facility; <u>no exceptions</u>. The parent/guardian may
  remain in the designated seating area during the rental;
- Rental contract holders will be required to submit a roster of those individuals participating and any coaches/trainers;
- · Water filling stations or taps will not be available; please bring your own filled water bottle(s);
- No coloured beverages (e.g. Gatorade) are allowed on or near the ice;



- Vending machines will be unavailable;
- Concessions may be open for take-out or curbside pick-up; however, no seating (besides the stands) will be available. (Participants are encouraged to visit the concessions to support these local community groups/businesses.).

Change (Dressing) Rooms:

- · Change Rooms will remain locked unless they are required to accommodate overflow of participants;
- A maximum of ten (10) participants—including youth, parents/guardians, coaches/trainers—is allowed;
- Masks must be worn at all times while in the change room.

#### Walking Track:

- A maximum of twenty (20) walkers will be allowed on the track at one time;
- At this time, no running or dry-land training will be allowed;
- Walkers are encouraged to provide their contact information (name and phone number) for contact tracing
  purposes. This information will be kept for 30 days and then destroyed;
- Walkers are encouraged to wear face coverings while walking;
- If necessary, walkers may use the seating identified for public use, ensuring they socially distance (6 ft./2m) or wear a mask.

Community Room Rentals (Caledonia Remax, Cayuga McSorley, Hagersville Almas Rooms):

- It is anticipated these spaces will re-open as of October 1;
- Please contact the Facility Booking Clerk (905-318-5932, ext. 6507) for updated occupancy numbers.

#### Seating (Stands):

- A maximum of forty (40) visitors will be allowed in the designated public seating area (to accommodate parents/guardians and walking track participants);
- Masks are encouraged to be worn while in this area; however, they <u>must</u> be worn if physical distancing of 6ft./2m cannot be achieved or if you move into common areas.
