Ice Scheduler's Report – John:

- Practice schedule currently updated to January 16 subject to change due to game cancellations & rescheduling
- Referee shortage issues & Covid Protocol cancellations continue to result in the cancellation of games. As we get closer to the game completion deadlines it will be harder to reschedule these games to be completed before the deadline. This needs to be communicated at the Haldimand LL & Southern Counties league meetings by the applicable VP as the issue could result in our teams not completing all games required before the deadline. League rules are that all regular season games must be played to be eligible for playoffs

- Bank Account as of December 5th is \$389,226.05.
- Year audit was completed and bill was paid with Brownlow in Ancaster
- Taxes submitted by Brownlow and received assessment back already.
- We have had some costs for jerseys and socks of \$4500 pus another of approximately \$6400 (replacing oversized jerseys and added AP jerseys plus socks)
- I have broken the ice costs down so we can see development, rep tryout and regular ice each season in QBooks
- Majority of Rep Teams have paid their team fees, a couple still outstanding
- An ask from convenors/everyone: please have all coaches/trainers fill in the Reimbursement form (Coaches Corner forms) if they would like to be reimbursed now that we have basically opened up hockey. Please sign ensuring they have proper receipts and completions if possible. This helps with completed forms instead of emails that I have to put together for them. Greatly appreciated if you could help with this.

Challenge Cup – Beth:

 parents attend the arena without a mask a list will be compiled by the gate keepers to provide to
 the arena staff if asked; Names are to be sent to the secretary to compile the list
- Can we develop goalies at a lower level as we have issues at U11 where there are two teams that do not have a goalie; according to the player pathway if a person wants to try to be a goalie, they have to be given the opportunity but we should be trying to develop goalies; there is an opportunity to have the older players come out and mentor the younger players can we compile a list of goalies that coaches can contact to come out and work with the goalies;

Calendar/Availability

For the traditional green screen option, we can provide up to four photographers that can photograph 4 teams per hour, at 15 minutes per team. For our "Pro" option, 20 mins per team is required. Minimum space is 15' x 15' per photographer. Location of photoshoot is decided by the league, usually taking place at the arena or community centre gym. Photos can be scheduled to be completed in one full day agreed upon beforehand or can be taken over several nights in smaller time frames. Photo dates will be booked on a first come first serve basis. No staffing by the league is required. However, having a league rep who is familiar with the teams is helpful for a smooth day!

Term

Agreements can be made on a 1-3-year basis.
